### **BUILDING FUTURES - Empowering youth to reach their full potential.**

We aim to ensure that children enter school with developmentally appropriate social, emotional, and intellectual skills. Students achieve academic success and transition to self-sufficiency as responsible, contributing members of the community.

- Literacy Initiatives: Expanding book access through programs like Reach Out and Read Pediatric Visit Books, Dolly Parton Imagination Library, and United We Read.
- Parental Support: Strengthening parenting skills to promote school readiness through Bright By Text and Born Learning Trails.

### COMMUNITY RESILIENCY - Enhancing well-being and supporting basic needs.

We provide a safety net for vulnerable individuals, ensuring access to essential services like food, housing, utility assistance, and transportation.

- Diversion Funding: Assisting those experiencing or at risk of homelessness.
- Montana211: A resource and information hotline.
- Income Supports: Offering programs like VITA free tax preparation.
- Housing Insecurity: Supporting families through the United to Solve Homelessness program.
- Poverty Immersion Experience: An interactive event to promote poverty awareness, understanding, and inspire local change.

### COMMUNITY RESOURCE CENTER - A hub for community leadership and collaboration.

A central gathering place for community leadership, organizational development, and volunteer service. We conduct regular free or low-cost trainings on staff development, grant writing, collective impact, Board governance, and DEI topics such as disability awareness and neurodiversity. Nonprofit organizations have complimentary access to spacious conference rooms, a variety of meeting rooms, 3-car double-sided (heated) garage, and 2 acres of tree-covered grass area, to solve community issues, promote collaboration, and encourage mutual understanding among diverse constituencies. Approximately 40 different organizations and companies use the building annually, totaling nearly 7,000 guests.

### VOLUNTEER ENGAGEMENT CENTER - Building capacity and mobilizing volunteers.

We connect individuals, families, corporate partners, and community groups with impactful volunteer opportunities, such as:

- Hands-on activities, supply drives, and one-time service projects like Workshop Wednesdays.
- Access to YouCanVolunteer.org: A matchmaking platform to connect community needs with volunteers and facilitate scheduling.
- Corporate Engagement: Helping businesses create meaningful team-building activities while achieving philanthropic goals.
- Community Drives: Collecting essentials like diapers, food, school supplies, socks, and books to unite our community in hope and strength.

# UNITED WE READ

Studies show that children who read proficiently by the end of third grade are four times more likely to graduate high school, making early reading support critical to long-term success. United We Read is an inspiring literacy event organized by the United Way of Yellowstone County, the Billings Education Foundation, and the Big J Show, dedicated to spreading the joy of reading to elementary students across Billings. This collaborative effort provides books to children in grades K-5, ensuring greater access to literacy resources for young learners. Volunteers are invited to participate by reading aloud to kids in grades K-3, making a direct impact on early literacy skills, as children who are read to consistently develop stronger vocabularies and comprehension abilities. Our Literacy Program also includes Reach Out and Read pediatric visit books, Dolly Parton Imagination Library, and our book distribution program.
