Partner Agency Funding Boosted to \$300,000



United Way of Yellowstone County awarded \$300,000 in grants to local non-profits on June 27, increasing support by \$75,000 compared to last year. These partner agencies are integral to combating poverty, improving access to education and resources, and providing mental health support – topics that are crucial for Yellowstone County amid continued inflation and wealth disparities.

Money will go to programs operated by 14 different local organizations. Each grant application was vetted by a section of UWYC's Community Impact Committee, totaling 30 local community members, then approved by UWYC's Board of Directors.

The following programs received funding. Click **HERE** for an explanation of each program:

Head Start, Inc, \$38,196: Literacy, language & lifelong success/conscious discipline implementation.

Billings Family YMCA, \$19,306: Educational components create school readiness preschool students.

Tumbleweed, \$10,000: Fostering enduring transformations that pave the way for brighter futures.

Young Families Early Head Start, \$20,000: Curriculum aids.

Education Foundation for Billings Public Schools, \$18,915: Mobile food program.

Friends of the Children – Eastern Montana, \$10,000: Investing in Billings' Youth: violent crime and gang prevention through relationship-based mentoring.

Special Olympics, \$10,000: Revitalization and engagement of Special Olympics Montana school age teams.

YWCA Billings, \$31,792: Crisis Stabilization for Victims of Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, and Human Trafficking.

Veterans Navigation Network, \$20,000: Resource Counseling, Case Management & Timely Intervention to Prevent Crisis.

Family Service, \$20,000: Feed, Furnish, Fortify.

District 7 HRDC, \$25,000: Wheels for Work/Homeless prevention program.

CASA of Yellowstone County, \$10,000: Volunteer court-appointed special advocates for youth in foster care.

Education Foundation for Billings Public Schools, \$10,000: Family Resource Center. **Adult Resource Alliance,** \$31,792: Senior Community Health Program. **Veterans Navigation Network**, \$15,000: Helping our senior veterans and their families to thrive.

Setting Kids Up For Success

Why supply?

- Billings Public Schools consistently has about 600 student who identify as unhoused and likely more who don't report their status.
- 40% of Billings Public School students qualify for free or reduced lunch
- Between 2021 and 2023, the average costs of school supplies rose 24%
- 94% of teachers surveyed nationwide spent their own money on school supplies for their students
- Most teachers spent between \$500 and \$700

Day of Action



We marshalled about 200 volunteers to Dover Park on June 19 for United Way of Yellowstone County's annual Day of Action. It was our second year partnering with the Yellowstone River Parks Association to improve the park



in the Billings Heights. Volunteers removed invasive species, repaired fencing, improved trails, stained bridges, and more! We had 20 different businesses and organizations turn out to help.

Day of Action is a chance for us to flex our volunteer-mobilization muscles and make a major dent in a community project. At Dover, volunteers put in more than 500 hours of work -- the equivalent of almost \$17,000! That helps make real improvements to the Billings' Heights premier green space. In turn, better green spaces help improve public safety and the mental and physical health of their neighbors. Volunteers get great benefits too -- volunteering combats feelings of loneliness and depression, and getting outside is great for mental health.



Fish on! Kids tackle a new activity at Lake Elmo



More than 100 kids from United Way of Yellowstone County's CARE Academy and Discover Zone programs got the chance to fish at Lake Elmo on June 27. Some kids caught fish; some screeched at the sight of worms. All of the kids got a chance to revel in the outdoors and sunshine.

We couldn't have pulled off a trip like this without dozens of volunteers; thank you especially to the

Billings Chapter of Walleye's Unlimited for grilling up lunch, and to Catholic Heart Workcamp for helping kids rig their poles, learn to cast, and untangle lines.

Montana FWP provided some great guidance about how to have fun while fishing responsibly, plus some wildlife education. Altana Federal Credit Union provided cool ice cream on a warm day.

This wasn't just a trip about catching fish; kids learned about patience and conservation, and got a chance to build some confidence learning a new skill.

Partner Agency Spotlight



Young Families Early Head Start (YFEHS) has been providing high quality childcare since 1983. What began as a program for teen parents and their babies has expanded to provide care for all children birth to five years. YFEHS also offers services to qualifying pregnant women and can continue serving their babies once they are born.

Through funding from United Way of Yellowstone County, YFEHS will be investing in new curriculum materials and additional teacher training programs, resulting in higher quality instruction and care for kids. UWYC values this partnership and looks forward to continuing to make a difference in the lives of those we serve.

History Lesson

The Highland Elementary CARE Academy program learned about a formative event in the American West last month -- The Battle of Little Bighorn. The group took a field trip to the battlefield to learn more about the history of the site.

CARE Academy and Discover Zone summer programs provide education and child care for about 130 kids. In addition to fighting the summer slide, a period of learning loss when school's out, programs like this are critical to helping parents stay in Yellowstone County's workforce.





Poverty simulation provides chance to live challenges

About 30 people from HRDC7 and Young Families Early Head Start attended a poverty simulation at United Way of Yellowstone County's headquarters on June 25. The event offers a window into some of the hard choices that poverty forces; participants have to navigate a simulation of challenges posed by employment, transportation, healthcare, finances, child care, housing, and more, coping with good and bad luck along the way. A four week timeline is compressed into an hour. The experience is designed to fostering empathy and understanding that can drive meaningful change.

Participants shared the following after the simulation:

- "I'm just sitting there and watching my family drown, and there's nothing I can do to help."
- "We're all sitting here frustrated."
- "It gave me a little more compassion."
- "It's just easy for us to say, 'just do this,' but really that's not realistic."
- "Oh, and I just thought I was getting ahead."
- "I'm trying to take care of all the basic needs...you do feel really helpless."

Volunteer for future Poverty Simulations

Volunteers are essential to this event. You'll operate community agencies within the simulation, helping to build a realistic environment that highlights the daily struggles of those living in poverty. Your role is crucial in creating a transformative experience for participants.


